2021: It's Faith Forward at Champion Shrine

As we open 2021 at Champion Shrine, it is with renewed faith, re-energized spirit and revitalized grounds and facilities.

For those of you who have not been on site in this past year, you will be happy to find, upon your return to Champion in 2021, many improvements, including: a new high altar in Chapel, an expanded Shrine Gift Shop and Schoolhouse Café, new stained glass windows in the Mother of Mercy Hall, newly-restored statuary and outdoor grottoes and a newly-paved pathway for our Rosary Walk, making it possible for people of all ages and abilities to pray here on site, 7 AM, until 7 PM, 365 days a year (*Wisconsin weather permitting*).

We were so grateful to have been one of the world's only Marian Apparition sites to have remained open for our pilgrims, administering the sacraments throughout the past year and adding more prayer and catechetical opportunities. We also found new and better ways to reach out to those who could not make it on site for Masses and events.



We are thankful for all of you, our pilgrims, supporters, donors and volunteers for making all of this possible. We give special thanks to our Blessed Mother.

As we open 2021, we are asking for your consideration, patience for one important update.



APPARITION ORATORY TEMPORARILY CLOSED FOR REVITALIZATION PROJECT JANUARY 25, 2021

It has come time for us to ensure the lower level of the Chapel, the Apparition Oratory, (formerly known as the crypt), remains a sacred, safe, comfortable and peaceful space for prayer and reflection.

While there will be no changes to the Oratory itself in terms of design and layout, we will need to update the heating and cooling system. For three weeks, beginning January 25, we will close the Apparition Oratory for an extensive HVAC upgrade to improve lower level airflow and create a less cluttered space.

We thank you in advance for your understanding of our need to keep the Shrine and its most important sacred areas updated for you and your families.

JOIN US FOR SUNDAY EVENING FAMILY ROSARY AT CHAMPION SHRINE

Beginning, Jan 10, 2021 on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, the Most Rev. David L. Ricken, Bishop of Green Bay, will introduce Sunday Family Rosary at Champion Shrine at 6:30 PM. Each Sunday thereafter, we will ask families to come out and pray the rosary with us at Champion Shrine or pray along remotely with us at <http://www.championshrine.org/livestream-rosary> together. If you are joining us on site, sign up through facebook or Champion Shrine Event Brite.

We encourage those of you who will be coming on site, particularly during this time in which the Oratory is closed, to take the time to pray on site during Adoration, held every day, Mon-Saturday in the Apparition Chapel between 12 PM until 3 PM.

On Sundays, we hold the Eucharistic Rosary Procession (*weather permitting*) outdoors after the 11 AM Mass, followed by Adoration until 3 PM. Adoration on Sundays is held between 12:40 PM and 2 PM, when we hold Holy Hour. When you are on site, also know that we pray Chaplet of Divine Mercy every day at 3 PM.

Mass will continue at 11 AM daily with additional Mass times at 8:30 AM Tuesday and Saturday.



With increased 2020 visitor stats signaling anticipated record attendance in 2021, The National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help, is looking to find committed, reliable volunteers who would like to put their God-given skills, talents, abilities, and personalities to work to help us spread the message and further the mission of Our Lady of Good Help.

There are a number of volunteer opportunities on site and online in the Shrine's gift shop and café. In addition, docents are needed for the welcome center and help is needed at Mother of Mercy Hall where larger Masses and Special Events, Speaking Engagements, Conferences are held. Our grounds and maintenance and facilities departments could also use help on

larger special event days and with special projects.

With an anticipated return to more bus groups again, our pilgrimage department could also use help assisting larger groups and those who are coming to the Shrine for retreats and special events. Volunteers are needed to contact groups to schedule pilgrimages, assist them with their pilgrimage and to follow up with those who have been on pilgrimage to the Shrine.

The Solemnity of the Annunciation of Our Lord

The Solemnity of the Annunciation celebrates the coming of the Angel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary to announce to her the special mission God had chosen for her in being the mother of His only son.

The feast of the Annunciation began to be celebrated on this day during the fourth and fifth centuries, soon after the date for celebrating Christmas was universalized throughout the Church. This feast celebrates the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Trinity and the salvation of all mankind. Thus March 25th is the day chosen, nine months before the birth of our Lord on Christmas.

For the Western Church, the Annunciation is a feast honoring the Virgin Mary as the mother of Christ. The emphasis of the celebration is placed on her acceptance of

this honor as the fulfillment of the prophecy written in Isaiah 7:14: "Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel."

It is highly appropriate to center our prayer around the restoration of the family during these feasts as they are a celebration of the beginnings of the Holy Family.

It is from this feast that the "Hail Mary" recitation of the Rosary and the Magnificat of Vespers have become a steadfast part of Catholic tradition.

The great Solemnity of the Annunciation of our Lord in the womb of Mary has always held a special place in the Catholic Church and continues to be a reminder of God's profound love for mankind.

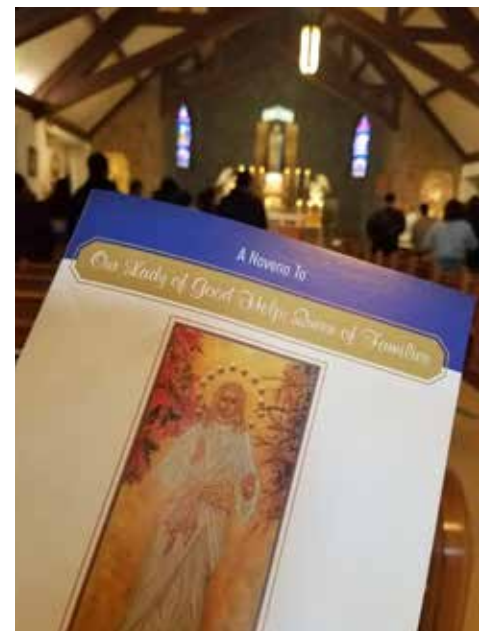

Our Mother of Mercy Hall allows us to host pilgrimage groups as well as larger groups for conferences and one-day retreats. We have been able to utilize Mother of Mercy Hall for scheduling pilgrimage lunches, retreats, teacher/educational conferences, the Green Bay Youth Conference, the Order of Malta pilgrimage, and the Flame of Love Conference. The building can be re-configured for groups from 10 to 1100, with even larger groups of up to 5,000 during summer months when we can also host indoor/outdoor events.

While you are welcome to come to Champion at any time on your own, to pray privately or with a group, there are ways in which we can help you organize a pilgrimage. Our pilgrimage planning department at the Shrine is here to assist you

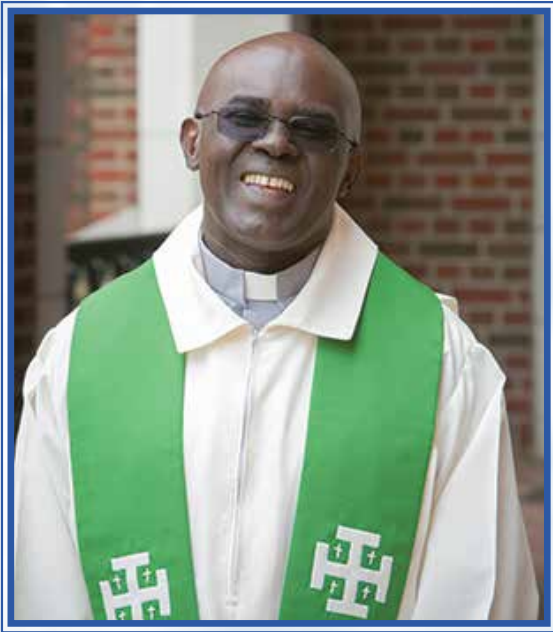

In Memoriam

**FATHER UBALD RUGIRANGOGA,
RWANDAN CATHOLIC PRIEST WHO WAS FREQUENT
CELEBRANT AT CHAMPION, PASSES AWAY**

*F*ather Ubald Rugirangoga, the Rwandan Catholic priest whose devastating experience with the loss of lives of loved ones, friends and parish members in the Rwandan genocide, inspired a personal ministry in, and charisma for healing, passed away early morning of January, 8, 2021* after a three-month battle with Covid-19 and its lingering effects. Fr. Rugirangoga had recently been hospitalized in Salt Lake City after having been transported to a facility at which he was battling lingering symptoms of the coronavirus. Father Ubald had been in the United States since the Spring of 2020 when restrictions on travel prevented him from returning to his native Rwanda.

Fr. Rugirangoga's life story of personal transformation through radical forgiveness has been the subject of a documentary, a popular TED Talk and, most recently, his own autobiography, *Forgiveness Makes You Free*. Fr. Ubald developed a charisma, through Jesus, for healing after forgiving the murderer of his mother and more than 80

family members. News of Father's healing charisma and story brought appearances in the United States where his strong Marian devotion drew him to America's only Church-approved Marian Apparition Site, the National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help in Champion, WI.

"We have always considered Father Ubald part of our extended family at the National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help. As such, we join the thousands worldwide who are mourning his passing," said Corrie Campbell, Shrine communications director and events coordinator. "As Christians, we also celebrate his life and share the hope his Holy example and witness on earth has him enter an eternity with Jesus whom he loved so much."

The strong presence of Mary that drew Father Ubald to Champion Shrine inspired him to immediately begin spreading the message of Our Lady of Good Help and led to return visits semi-annually at which he celebrated Masses with Eucharistic healing prayer services that drew more than 25,000 to Champion Shrine over the course of the past five years.

"The Fathers of Mercy and the National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help are grateful Father Ubald felt called to Champion. We were blessed to have concelebrated many Masses with him here at the Shrine," said Father John Broussard, rector of the National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help. "Father Ubald's Eucharistic Healing Prayer Services and his ministry of preaching healing through forgiveness provided peace and healing to thousands, many of whom claimed graces through prayers here on site and remotely when he prayed the Rosary from Champion. It is with full faith in the real presence of Our Lord that he inspired, that Champion Shrine continues its Masses with Eucharistic Healing prayer services every last Saturday of the month here at Champion, under the mantle of Mary, Our Lady of Good Help."

Paving the Way for the Eucharistic Rosary Procession

During the late spring when Masses were temporarily suspended throughout much of the country, the Shrine staff looked to the example of Adele Brise to pray and commit acts of faith when facing a “firestorm”. This inspired the idea of a Eucharistic Rosary Procession in place of what would have been the normal Sunday Mass, eventually giving way to a daily procession, giving pilgrims an opportunity to worship God and honor his presence. As fall approached, staff began discussing the possibility of continuing the Eucharistic Rosary Procession through the winter months. At this point the Rosary Pathway was gravel which made it difficult to keep the pathway clear during the long Wisconsin winters.

By the end of October, it was decided it would be best to pave the Rosary Pathway so we could continue the Eucharistic Rosary Procession. The contractor who would complete the project sadly told staff the cold weather had set in and paving was done for the season. Our Blessed Mother had other plans.

If you live in Wisconsin or have visited Wisconsin during November, you know typical Wisconsin November weather is in the 40's. This by no means is optimal paving weather. On Wednesday, November 4th, 2020 the temperature at The Shrine was 68 degrees. Unseasonable warm is an understatement. The forecast for the following days looked even better. Staff became optimistic and called the paving contractor to see if there was room in their schedule. Our Blessed Mother clearly wanted the Rosary Pathway paved because the contractor did have room in their schedule and was happy to come out the following day to start preparing for the project.

On Friday, November 6th, 2020 the contractor started the two-day long project of paving the Rosary Pathway in 72-degree weather. By Sunday, November 7th, 2020 it was 75 degrees and the Rosary Pathway was paved and ready to welcome pilgrims for the Eucharistic Rosary Procession.

In a matter of a week staff went from believing the paving of the pathway would not be complete until the

following summer, which would also force the Eucharistic Rosary Procession to not take place during the winter months, to walking on the newly paved pathway. At the end of November, a generous donor came forward and fully funded the project.

We are thankful to the contractor for paving the pathway on such short notice and the generous donor who financially made the project possible. We are most thankful to Our Blessed Mother, who without her divine intervention this project would not have been completed so quickly. We invite you to join us now every Sunday after the 11:00 a.m. Mass for the Eucharistic Rosary Procession, where we can walk with Jesus and pray to His Blessed Mother.
